Re: East White Horse Beach "Oceanside"
Association

This will confirm meeting held at Town Hall, Plymouth, Massachusetts, May 11, 1976, with Executive Secretary Dudman, at which were present Anthony Coscia, Treasurer of captioned association; Priscilla Tupper, Secretary, and the writer.

As attorney for captioned association, the writer furnished Mr. Dudman with a copy of an opinion letter reflecting examination of title of the beach property as being a "private" beach. It was agreed that signs would be appropriately placed on the beach to afford the police the right to limit vehicular traffic on the beach.

Reiterating the commendation of the association for police and town cooperation, it was agreed that in addition to inviting the Plymouth Police Commissioner to the meeting for discussion, the meeting of the association would also consider the methods of reporting complaints to the police. It was recognized that a multiplicity of complaints on the same issue might well result in less than total response by the police.

The need for traffic control signs on Taylor Avenue was discussed, and the matter is to be referred to the Department of Public Works for study and recommendation.

The need for incandescent lights to be placed on existing poles in certain areas of what is known as Avenue A Oceanside was reiterated. Mr. Dudman stated that this matter would be considered further by the Selectmen.

Mr. Dudman suggested that contact be had with the Manomet Sewer Study Commission to determine facts concerning location of processing plant and availability of sewerage in the plan for the "Oceanside" area. Mr. Coscia stated that he would be in contact with Mr. Tony Morgardo (phonetic) of the Manomet Sewer Study Commission.

If the town has any suggestions designed to bring about a more effective relationship between the town and the residents of "Oceanside", the association will bring such to consideration by the association.
